

Objectives

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1. 85% satisfaction expressed by members and trainees about their experience with WGI and its programs by 2018. 95% by 2020.
 2. 20,000 members by 2021.
 3. 60% of all new trainees become members of WGI and continue for two or more years.
 4. 5,000 participants have taken the Take Charge of Your Life program around the world by 2020.
 5. 30,000 people have completed a WGI certification program around the world between CTRTC/RTC, CT/RT Counseling, and Teaching with CT.
 6. More than 1,500 people attend the three conferences of 2016, 2018, and 2020.

 3. Programs translated into different languages offered through the worldwide interactive portal.
 4. Shorter, competency-based, accredited, and innovative specialized certification programs in teaching with CT, RT Counseling, Lead-Managing with CT, and Personal Well-being with CT.




- 5. Scholarships offered to students for courses, workshops, and certification programs.
- 6. Revise programs to include useful competencies and certifications for participants.
- 7. Support and promote member organization projects and events.
- 8. Workshops and post certification courses of various formats created by faculty and endorsed by WGI offered around the world. WGI's web-based application supports the implementation. Various topics around the application of CT in counseling, managing, leading, teaching, parenting, mental health, marriage, and others.

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9. In every course people are offered membership of WGI that is need satisfying (defined by people renewing membership).
 10. Target specific groups with purpose-created programs for aging population, youth, children, care givers, etc.
 11. Implement a professional e-marketing innovative plan that creates WGI presence in the world: adwords, organic website, social media.

Faculty and Staff: Objectives



1. Double faculty membership around the world by 2021 (about 400).
2. 85% satisfaction level between all faculty members by 2018 about their experience with WGI as faculty. 95% by 2020.

Faculty and Staff:

Approaches



1. Design, implement, and encourage new specialized faculty programs for the different certification programs offered by WGI in counseling, education, and lead-management. They will be based on competence and could be of hybrid formats like web-based and physically. Stop current generic Basic Instructor Program?
2. Promote and facilitate the endorsement of Take Charge facilitators.
3. Encourage and support faculty members to develop and offer their own workshops and post-certification programs endorsed by WGI through a simple, agile, flexible, and quality process.
4. **How can WGI include certified members as possible teachers on behalf of WGI?**

Faculty and Staff:

Approaches

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5. New web application so that faculty members can register participants, pay participant fees, print certificates, include adaptations and recommendations of programs done, etc. This app would include the faculty-designed workshops and post certification programs endorsed by WGI, as well as WGI certification programs.
 6. Recertification every two years of faculty through an online and evidence-based process.
 7. Training of faculty in teaching and assessing with useful competencies in mind, as well as in pedagogical techniques based in CT.
 8. Create an engaging and inspiring faculty network to foster belonging and sharing of knowledge and resources through the web-based app.

Faculty and Staff:

Approaches

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9. Promotional and educational web-based videos available for the different programs.
 10. Useful and relevant professional days after conferences and other dates, virtual and physical.
 11. Web-based project management and interactivity for WGI Board and Staff.
 12. Restructure representation on the board with member organizations taken into account?
